WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, all parties hereto acknowledge that Macon County, NC, Clay County, NC, Cherokee County, NC, and The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., did enter into an Interlocal Agreement and Contract for the Procurement, Implementation and Operation of SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project, on or about March 13, 2014, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference; and

THAT WHEREAS, all parties hereto acknowledge that Macon County, NC, Clay County, NC, Cherokee County, NC, The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., and Jackson County, NC, did enter into Amendments to Interlocal Agreement and Contract for the Procurement, Implementation and Operation of SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project on or about July 18, 2014, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, all parties hereto acknowledge that Macon County, NC, Clay County, NC, Cherokee County, NC, The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., and Jackson County, NC, now desire to amend said Interlocal Agreement as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and as amended by the Amendments thereto as set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto so as to include Graham County, NC, and Mountain Projects, Inc. a North Carolina Non-Profit Corporation, as principals and as parties under the same in accordance with the terms and conditions as hereinafter provided; and

WHEREAS, all parties hereto acknowledge that Graham County, NC, and Mountain Projects, Inc., a North Carolina Non-Profit Corporation, now desire for the parties to such Interlocal

Agreement as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and the Amendments thereto as set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto to amend the same so as to include Graham County, NC, and Mountain Projects, Inc., a North Carolina Non-Profit Corporation, as principals and parties under the same in accordance with the terms and conditions as hereinafter provided; and

WHEREAS, the transportation agencies of each of the parties hereto have been discussing the need to cooperate better with one another for the purpose of providing better and more efficient public transportation services to the Veterans and their families within Macon, Clay, Cherokee Swain, Jackson, Graham and Haywood Counties to medical services and for other purposes; and

WHEREAS, the transportation agencies of each of the parties hereto have decided to work together to implement a system to provide better and more efficient public transportation services to the Veterans and their families within Macon, Clay, Cherokee, Swain, Jackson, Graham and Haywood Counties to medical services and for other purposes; and

WHEREAS, the transportation agencies of each of the parties hereto have decided upon trying to cooperatively procure, implement and operate a system to provide better and more efficient public transportation services to the Veterans and their families within Macon, Clay, Cherokee, Swain, Jackson, Graham and Haywood Counties to medical services and other purposes; and

WHEREAS, toward that end, the transportation agencies of each of the parties hereto acknowledge that Macon County, NC, applied for a Grant in order to aid and assist it in securing a Grant for the purposes of procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and with the option to add Jackson in such project, as proposed in the Grant Proposal prepared by Kim Angel, Transit Director for Macon County Transit, dated April 19, 2012, (hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Proposal" a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and the same is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, Macon County, NC, has in fact been able to secure a Grant to aid and assist in the procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and with the option to add Jackson County in such project, in accordance with the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and the same is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, and Jackson County, North Carolina had an anticipated total project cost of \$536,705.29 rather than the anticipated total project cost set forth in Interlocal Agreement referenced hereinabove in the sum of \$479,134.00; and

WHEREAS, under said Grant Agreement, Macon County, North Carolina, has secured through the North Carolina Department of Transportation, Federal Funds in the amount of 80% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina,), and with the option to add Jackson County in such project, not in excess of \$459,873.00; and

WHEREAS, Graham County, NC, and Mountain Projects, Inc., have made their own arrangements for funding their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs in connection with the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportion in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, will require the full cooperation and assistance of each party hereto and all parties hereto desire to fully cooperate and assist in the effective and efficient procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina and Haywood County, NC, as provided for herein; and

WHEREAS, in order to comply with said Grant Agreement and in order to begin the procurement process for said SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation, Macon County has duly advertised for Requests for Proposals for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and with the option to add Jackson County, Graham County, and Mountain Projects, Inc., in such project, and has entered into a contract with the vendor for the benefit of Macon County, Clay County, Cherokee County, The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., and Jackson County for procurement; and

WHEREAS, at the time of duly advertising for Request for Proposals for SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project, Macon County did require the vendors submitting proposals to make all pricing given in response to the Request for Proposal available to Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., as well, in case those entities desired to join the SoNCVet Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project; and

WHEREAS, Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., desire to take advantage of the pricing secured from the vendor selected by Macon County, for their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs to participate in SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project, and each will pay their full cost for their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs for the same; and

WHEREAS, all parties hereto do desire to enter these Second Amendments to the Interlocal Agreement and Contract and Amendments thereto above-referenced, to signify their respective agreements to follow the Interlocal Agreement and Contract and Amendments thereto as referenced hereinabove and as amended hereby and to fully cooperate and assist in the effective and efficient procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County,

North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina in accordance with the terms and conditions provided for herein.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES AND THE COVENANTS AND CONDITIONS CONTAINED HEREINAFTER, THE PARTIES HERETO DO AGREE TO AMEND THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT AND CONTRACT FOR THE PROCUREMENT, IMPLEMENTATION AND OPERATION OF THE SonCvet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project, and the Amendments thereto copies of which are attached hereto as Exhibits A and B respectively and incorporated herein by reference AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., are hereby made parties to and Principals in said Interlocal Agreement and Contract and Amendments thereto in accordance with the terms and conditions contained hereinafter.
- 2. **Section 1.** Designation of Lead Agency., of said Interlocal Agreement and Contract and Amendments are amended and rewritten to read:

"The parties hereto hereby designate Macon County as the Lead Agency for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina. Macon County Transit and its Director shall lead the procurement, implementation and operation thereof in cooperation with the Transit Directors of the Transit Agencies of the other parties hereto. All other parties hereto and their Transit Agencies and Transit Directors shall work cooperatively with Macon County Transit as the Lead Agency and its Director in connection with the procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, NC. However notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., shall be responsible for securing and satisfying all of their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs for their participation in SonCVet Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina and Haywood County, North Carolina. In securing and satisfying all of their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs. Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., may use and take advantage of the pricing secured from the vendor selected by Macon County, for their procurement, implementation and operation needs to participate in SoNCVet; Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project, and each will pay their full cost for their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs for the same.

3. Section 2. <u>Purposes of Agreement.</u>, of said Interlocal Agreement and Amendments are amended and rewritten to read as follows:

To allow the Procuring Agent to obtain proposals for demand response scheduling and routing software, tablets, web portal, interactive voice response telephone system as part of the One Call One Click initiative for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, in accordance with applicable Federal and State law, and to enable procurement of the same by the Procuring Agent for itself and the Principals as provided for herein. All parties hereto understand and agree that the Procuring Agent has now obtained such a proposal and contracted with the vendor for has entered into a contract with the vendor for the benefit of Macon County, Clay County, Cherokee County, The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., and Jackson County for procurement. All parties hereto are satisfied with the same. However notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., shall be responsible for securing and satisfying all of their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs for their participation in SoNCVet Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina and Haywood County, North Carolina. In securing and satisfying all of their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs, Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., may use and take advantage of the pricing secured from the vendor selected by Macon County, for their procurement, implementation and operation needs to participate in SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project, and each will pay all of their full cost for their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs for the same.
- (b). For the Procuring Agent and the Principals to agree to cooperatively implement within Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, and Jackson County, North Carolina, the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, in accordance with applicable Federal and State law, as provided for herein; and
- (c) For the Procuring Agent and the Principals to agree to cooperatively operate within Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, in accordance with applicable Federal and State law, as provided for herein.

4. Section 9. <u>Implementation</u>, of said Interlocal Agreement and Amendments are amended and rewritten to read as follows:

"Macon County as the Lead Agency for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, and through Macon Transit Agency and its Director shall lead the implementation thereof in cooperation with the Transit Directors of the Transit Agencies of the other parties hereto. All other parties hereto and their Transit Agencies and Transit Directors agree to and shall work cooperatively with Macon County Transit as the Lead Agency and its Director as well as the vendor selected in connection with the implementation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, as proposed in the Grant Proposal prepared by Kim Angel, Transit Director for Macon County Transit, dated April 19, 2012, (hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Proposal") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference, and in accordance with the terms of the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference."

5. **Section 10.** Operation., of said Interlocal Agreement and Amendments are amended and rewritten to read as follows:

"Macon County as the Lead Agency for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, and through Macon Transit Agency and its Director shall lead the operation thereof in cooperation with the Transit Directors of the Transit Agencies of the other parties hereto. All other parties hereto and their Transit Agencies and Transit Directors agree to and shall work cooperatively with Macon County Transit as the Lead Agency and its Director in connection with the operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, as proposed in the Grant Proposal prepared by Kim Angel, Transit Director for Macon County Transit, dated April 19, 2012, (hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Proposal") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference, and in accordance with the terms of the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference."

6. **Section 11.** <u>Miscellaneous.</u>, of said Interlocal Agreement and Amendments are amended and rewritten to read as follows:

- "(a) <u>Duration</u>. This Agreement shall be 60-months from the effective date as set forth in the Interlocal Agreement as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto, unless terminated earlier by mutual agreement. The Agreement may be extended for such additional time as the parties all deem appropriate. The governing body of each party hereto has determined that this duration is reasonable by their approval and execution hereof. On such termination, obligations of either side that are still executory are hereby discharged, but any rights based on prior breach or performance survive.
- (b) Amendment and Termination. This Agreement may be amended by mutual agreement of the parties. This Agreement is terminated at the end of its duration as provided for herein or as hereinafter modified or may be terminated in accordance with the Agreement of all of the parties hereto.
- (c) <u>Benefit of Agreement</u>. This Agreement is for the benefit of only the parties hereto and not any other person, firm, or corporation.
- (e) Nature of Agreement and Transaction. Macon County has the responsibility under this Agreement to conduct a procurement as described in this Agreement and to enter into the procurement contract for the benefit of the Procuring Agent and the Principals. also as described in this Agreement. In performing under this Agreement, the Procuring Agent is acting as the agent on behalf of the Principals, and on its own behalf and the Procuring Agent may also purchase Goods and Services for itself from the same procurement contract. The Procuring Agent does not warrant, or give any opinion, that this procedure, by which the procuring Agent solicits proposals and enters into procurement contract on behalf of the Principals, will be successful or effective. The Principals shall not hold the Procuring Agent liable for any deficiencies in, or failure of this procedure. The Principals shall indemnify the Procuring Agent for, and hold the Procuring Agent harmless from, any claim by any person, firm, or corporation regarding this procedure or regarding the sale or purchase of the Goods and Services. The PROCURING AGENT SHALL NOT BE LIABLE TO THE PRINCIPALS ON ANY EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO MERCHANTIABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE) with respect to any of the Goods and Services. However notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., shall be responsible for securing and satisfying their all of their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs for their participation in SoNCVet Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina and Haywood County, North Carolina. In securing and satisfying all of their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs, Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., may use and take advantage of the pricing secured from the vendor selected by Macon County, for their procurement, implementation and operation needs to participate in SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project, and each will pay their full cost for their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs for the same. The parties hereto agree to procure, implement and operate the SoNCVet. Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North

Carolina, Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina, and Haywood County, North Carolina, as provided for hereinabove.

(f) Method of Financing the Undertaking, Including the Apportionment of Costs and Revenues. The procurement of the Goods and Services for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation will be financed as follows:

Federal Funds in the amount of 80% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation, not in excess of \$459,873.00 from the Grant Agreement above-referenced;

Macon County shall pay the sum of \$16,905.00 unto Macon County as its share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. In addition, Macon County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Clay County shall pay the sum of \$ 16,905.00 unto Macon County, upon its execution of this Agreement as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Clay County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Cherokee County shall pay the sum of \$ 16,905.00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Cherokee County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA:

The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., a North Carolina Non-Profit Corporation, shall pay the sum of \$15,452.00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Jackson County shall pay the sum of \$16,178.00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Jackson County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc., shall be responsible for securing and satisfying all of their respective procurement, implementation and operation needs for their participation in SoNCVet Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina,

Jackson County, North Carolina, Graham County, North Carolina and Haywood County, North Carolina.

Each party hereto shall pay for all its employees which are required to implement and operate the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project cooperatively with the other parties hereto.

Each party hereto shall be entitled to the fares that it charges for the rides that it provides through the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project cooperatively with the other parties hereto.

- (g) Each party hereto shall at its sole expense during the term of this Agreement maintain, repair and if necessary replace such equipment placed into service in its home County for use in connection with this project. Each party hereto shall be responsible for payment of all maintenance and service fees, hosting fees and data charges incurred within their County for years 2-5.
- (h) Each party hereto shall ratify this Agreement by resolution of the its Governing Board and spread the same upon its minutes."
- 7. That the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, and Jackson County, North Carolina will have an anticipated total project cost of \$536,705.29 together with the anticipated procurement, implementation and operation costs to Graham County, North Carolina, in the amount of \$111,520.71, and the anticipated procurement, implementation and operation costs to Mountain Projects, Inc., in the amount of \$112,990.14.
- 8. The following provisions of the Interlocal Agreement as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto have no application to Graham County, North Carolina, and Mountain Projects, Inc.:
 - A. Section 3. Delegation of Authority.
 - B. Section 5. Procurement Procedures.
 - Section 6. Award of Contract.
 - D. Section 8. Procurement.

These Second Amendments to the Interlocal Agreement and Contract for the Procurement, Implementation and Operation of SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project, and Amendments thereto, copies of which is attached hereto as Exhibits A and B and incorporated herein by reference have been executed by the Principals and the Procuring Agent by and through duly authorized representatives.

WHEREAS, under said Grant Agreement, Macon County, North Carolina, has secured through the North Carolina Department of Transportation, Federal Funds in the amount of 80% of the actual net cost of the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, not in excess of \$489,873.00; and

WHEREAS, under said Grant Agreement, local share is anticipated in the amount of 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County; North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto contemplate sharing the obligation for such local share as provided for herein; and

WHEREAS, the procurement, implementation and operation of the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, will require the full cooperation and assistance of each party hereto and all parties hereto desire to fully cooperate and assist in the effective and efficient procurement, implementation and operation of the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, as provided for herein; and

WHEREAS, in order to comply with said Grant Agreement and in order to begin the procurement process for said SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation, Macon County has duly advertised for Requests for Proposals for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and has secured a proposal from a vendor that it would recommend for this project on the condition that each party hereto executes this Interlocal Agreement and Contract, signifying its agreement to follow this Agreement and to fully cooperate and assist in the effective and efficient procurement, Implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, in accordance with the terms and conditions provided for herein; and

WHEREAS, all parties hereto do desire to enter this Interlocal Agreement and Contract, to signify their respective agreements to follow this Agreement and to fully cooperate and assist in

the effective and efficient procurement, implementation and operation of the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, in accordance with the terms and conditions provided for herein.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES AND THE COVENANTS AND CONDITIONS CONTAINED HEREINAFTER, THE PARTIES HERETO DO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Designation of Lead Agency.

The parties hereto hereby designate Macon County as the Lead Agency for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, Macon County Transit and its Director shall lead the procurement, implementation and operation thereof in cooperation with the Transit Directors of the Transit Agencies of the other parties hereto. All other parties hereto and their Transit Agencies and Transit Directors shall work cooperatively with Macon County Transit as the Lead Agency and its Director in connection with the procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina.

Section 2. <u>Purposes of Agreement</u>. The purposes of this Agreement ("Agreement") are threefold as follows:

- (a). To allow the Procuring Agent to obtain proposals for demand response scheduling and routing software, tablets, web portal, interactive voice response telephone system as part of the One Call One Click Initiative for the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Ctay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina in accordance with applicable Federal and State law, and to enable procurement of the same by the Procuring Agent for itself and the Principals as provided for herein;
- (b). For the Procuring Agent and the Principals to agree to cooperatively Implement within Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, the SonCvet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, in accordance with applicable Federal and State law, as provided for herein; and
- (c). For the Procuring Agent and the Principal to agree to cooperatively operate within Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swein County, North Carolina, in accordance with applicable Federal and State law, as provided for herein.

Section 3. Delegation of Authority. The Principals hereby delegate unto the Procuring Agent the authority to conduct a Request for Proposal for the Principals and the Procuring Agent for the purchase, delivery and installation of demand response routing and scheduling software, including regional coordination, tablets, web access and interactive voice response telephone system (referred to hereafter as "Goods and Services") for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and in accordance with the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference, and do hereby ratify in full its efforts in that regard. The Principals do further delegate unto the Procuring Agent the authority to enter into procurement a contract for the purchase of the Goods and Services on behalf of the Procuring Agent and on behalf of the Principals for the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, in accordance with the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference. This Agreement does not obligate the Procuring Agent or the Principals to purchase any of the Goods or Services.

Section 4. Effective Date of Agreement. This Agreement shall become effective on February ______, 2014.

Section 5. Procurement Procedures. This Procurement shall follow the requirements set forth in the North Carolina General Statutes 143-129,8 and in the Federal Transportation Authority (FTA) Circular 4220.1F. All Terms and Conditions set forth in the Request for Proposal document dated November 27, 2013, entitled "SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation - Macon County, Lead Agency", are hereby incorporated by reference. Macon County shall also comply with its Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Program Grant Agreement with the North Carolina Department of Transportation, DOT Number: DOT-19, Project Number: 13-04-0052. All Principals shall cooperate with the Procuring Agent and agree to comply with all those requirements applicable to the Procuring Agent imposed by the Procuring Agency's Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Program Grant Agreement with the North Carolina Department of Transportation, DOT Number: DOT-19, Project Number: 13-04-0052 and the FTA Master Agreement.

Section 6. Award of Contract. The proposals shall be reviewed by the Transit Director for Macon County Transit and the Transit Director will present a recommendation to the Macon County Commissioners for the award of the procurement contract for the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, and Swain County, North Carolina, All parties hereto shall comply with the provisions of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 143-128.8 (d) which provides that such proposals shall not be subject to public inspection until a contract is awarded. The Macon County Board of Commissioners may consider, but is not bound by the recommendation. Macon County, within its sole discretion, will award any procurement contract. Once the procurement contract has been executed by the Procuring Agent for the benefit of the Procuring Agent and the Principals and the vendor, a copy of procurement contract shall be forwarded to the Principals.

Section 7. Record Retention. The Procuring Agent and the Principals agree to retain all documentation relating to the procurement for a period of not less than five years after the date of the last delivery pursuant to the procurement, except in the event of litigation or settlement of claims arising from the performance of the procurement contract(s), in which case the Procuring Agent and Principals agree to maintain same until all such litigation, appeals, claims or exception related thereto have been resolved.

Section 8. **Procurement** Macon County as the Lead Agency for the ScNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swaln County, North Carolina, and through Macon Transit Agency and its Director shall lead the procurement of the Goods and Services needed for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina. All other parties hereto and their Transit Agencies and Transit Directors agree to and shall work cooperatively with Macon County Transit as the Lead Agency and its Director in connection with the procurement of goods and services necessary for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, as proposed in the Grant Proposal prepared by Kim Angel, Transit Director for Macon County Transit, dated April 19, 2012. (hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Proposal") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference, and in accordance with the terms of the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hareinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference.

Section 9. Implementation. Macon County as the Lead Agency for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and through Macon Transit Agency and its Director shall lead the implementation thereof in cooperation with the Transit Directors of the Transit Agencies of the other parties hereto. Section 10. Operation. hereto. In performing under this Agreement, the Procuring Agent is acting as the agent on behalf of the Principals, and on its own behalf and the Procuring Agent may also purchase Goods and Services for itself from the same procurement contract. The Procuring Agent does not warrant, or give any opinion, that this procedure, by which the procuring Agent solicits proposals and enters into procurement contract on behalf of the Principals, will be successful or effective. The Principals shall not hold the Procuring Agent liable for any deficiencies in, or failure of, this procedure. The Principals shall indemnify the Procuring Agent for, and hold the Procuring Agent harmless from, any claim by any person, firm, or corporation regarding this procedure or regarding the sale or purchase of the Goods and Services. The PROCURING AGENT SHALL NOT BE LIABLE TO THE PRINCIPALS ON ANY EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO MERCHANTIABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE) with respect to any of the Goods and Services. Federal Funds in the amount of 80% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation, not in excess of \$459,873.00 from the Grant Agreement above-referenced;

Macon County shall pay the sum of \$18,110.00 unto Macon County as its share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. In addition, Macon County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$6,250.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Clay County shall pay the sum of \$18,110.00 unto Macon County, upon its execution of this Agreement as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Clay County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$6,250.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Cherokee County shall pay the sum of \$18,110.00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Cherokee County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$6,250.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., a North Carolina Non-Profit Corporation, shall pay the sum of \$16,500.00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$6,250.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Each party hereto shall pay for all its employees which are required to implement and operate the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project cooperatively with the other parties hereto.

Each party hereto shall be entitled to the fares that it charges for the rides that it provides through the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project cooperatively with the other parties hereto.

(g) Each party hereto shall at its sole expense during the term of this Agreement maintain, repair and if necessary replace such equipment placed into service in its home County for use in connection with this project. Each party hereto shall be responsible for payment of all maintenance and service fees, hosting fees and data charges incurred within their County for years 2-5.

(h) Each party hereto shall ratify this Agreement by resolution of the its Governing Board and spread the same upon its minutes.

Section 12 Governing Law and Forum. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of North Carolina. The exclusive forum for all actions arising out of this Agreement, that are between the parties to this Agreement, shall be the North Carolina General Court of Justica, in North Carolina.

Section 13. Macon County Policy. Macon County is committed to ensuring that no person is excluded from participating in or denied the benefits of any of the county's services on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability or socioeconomic status as protected by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Executive Order on Environmental Justice. Anyone believing to have been subjected to discrimination under Title VI by the county, its employees or agents, are entitled to file a complaint.

All other parties hereto and their Transit Agencies and Transit Directors agree to and shall work cooperatively with Macon County Transit as the Lead Agency and its Director in connection with the operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North

Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, and Jackson County, North Carolina, as proposed in the Grant Proposal prepared by Kim Angel, Transit Director for Macon County Transit, dated April 19, 2012, (hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Proposal") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference, and in accordance with the terms of the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference."

- 9. **Section 11. Miscellaneous.**, of said Interlocal Agreement is amended and rewritten to read as follows:
 - "(a) <u>Duration</u>. This Agreement shall be 60-months unless terminated earlier by mutual agreement. The Agreement may be extended for such additional time as the parties all deem appropriate. The governing body of each party hereto has determined that this duration is reasonable by their approval and execution hereof. On such termination, obligations of either side that are still executory are hereby discharged, but any rights based on prior breach or performance survive.
 - (b) Amendment and Termination. This Agreement may be amended by mutual agreement of the parties. This Agreement is terminated at the end of its duration as provided for herein or as hereinafter modified or may be terminated in accordance with the Agreement of all of the parties hereto.
 - (c) <u>Benefit of Agreement</u>. This Agreement is for the benefit of only the parties hereto and not any other person, firm, or corporation.
 - (e) Nature of Agreement and Transaction. Macon County has the responsibility under this Agreement to conduct a procurement as described in this Agreement and to enter into the procurement contract for the benefit of the Procuring Agent and the Principals, also as described in this Agreement. In performing under this Agreement, the Procuring Agent is acting as the agent on behalf of the Principals, and on its own behalf and the Procuring Agent may also purchase Goods and Services for itself from the same procurement contract. The Procuring Agent does not warrant, or give any opinion, that this procedure, by which the procuring Agent solicits proposals and enters into procurement contract on behalf of the Principals, will be successful or effective. The Principals shall not hold the Procuring Agent liable for any deficiencies in, or failure of this procedure. The Principals shall indemnify the Procuring Agent for, and hold the Procuring Agent harmless from, any claim by any person, firm, or corporation regarding this procedure or regarding the sale or purchase of the Goods and Services. The PROCURING AGENT SHALL NOT BE LIABLE TO THE PRINCIPALS ON ANY EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO MERCHANTIABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE) with respect to any of the Goods and Services. The parties hereto agree to procure, implement and operate the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, and Jackson County, North Carolina, as provided for hereinabove.
 - (f) Method of Financing the Undertaking, Including the Apportionment of Costs and Revenues. The procurement of the Goods and Services for the SoNCVet; Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation will be financed as follows:

Federal Funds in the amount of 80% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation, not in excess of \$459,873.00 from the Grant Agreement above-referenced;

Macon County shall pay the sum of \$16,905.00 unto Macon County as its share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. In addition, Macon County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA:

Clay County shall pay the sum of\$ 16,905.00 unto Macon County, upon its execution of this Agreement as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Clay County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Cherokee County shall pay the sum of\$ 16,905,00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Cherokee County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., a North Carolina Non-Profit Corporation, shall pay the sum of \$15,452.00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., shall provide "In-kind" contributions to the project having a val_ue of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Jackson County shall pay the sum of \$16,178.00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Jackson County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$5,000.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Each party hereto shall pay for all its employees which are required to implement and operate the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project cooperatively with the other parties hereto.

Each party hereto shall be entitled to the fares that it charges for the rides that it provides through the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project cooperatively with the other parties hereto.

(g) Each party hereto shall at its sole expense during the term of this Agreement maintain, repair and if necessary replace such equipment placed into service in its home County for use in connection with this project. Each party hereto shall be responsible for

payment of all maintenance and service fees, hosting fees and data charges incurred within their County for years 2-5.

- (h) Each party hereto shall ratify this Agreement by resolution of the its Governing Board and spread the same upon its minutes."
- 10. That the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, Swain County, North Carolina, and Jackson County, North Carolina will have an anticipated total project cost of \$536,705.29 rather than the anticipated total project cost set forth in Interlocal Agreement referenced hereinabove in the sum of \$479,134.00.

These Amendments to the Interlocal Agreement and Contract for the Procurement, Implementation and Operation of SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation Project, on or about March 13, 2014, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference have been executed by the Principals and the Procuring Agent by and through duly authorized representatives.

WHEREAS, toward that end, the transportation agencies of each of the parties hereto have heretofore settled upon having Macon County, NC, apply for a Grant in order to aid and assist it in securing a Grant for the purposes of procurement, Implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, as proposed in the Grant Proposal prepared by Kim Angel, Transit Director for Macon County Transit, dated April 19, 2012, (hereinafter referred to as the 'Grant Proposal') a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and the same is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, Macon County, NC, has been able to secure a Grant to aid and assist in the procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet; Southwestern NC One-Call One

Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, in accordance with the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and the same is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, has an anticipated total project cost of \$479.134.00; and

WHEREAS, under said Grant Agreement, Macon County, North Carolina, has secured through the North Carolina Department of Transportation, Federal Funds in the amount of 80% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swaln County, North Carolina, not in excess of \$459,873.00; and

WHEREAS, under said Grant Agreement, local share is anticipated in the amount of 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swaln County, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto contemplate sharing the obligation for such local share as provided for herein; and

WHEREAS, the procurement, implementation and operation of the SonCvet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swaln County, North Carolina, will require the full cooperation and assistance of each party hereto and all parties hereto desire to fully cooperate and assist in the effective and efficient procurement, implementation and operation of the SonCvet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, as provided for herein; and

WHEREAS, in order to comply with said Grant Agreement and in order to begin the procurement process for said SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation, Macon County has duly advertised for Requests for Proposals for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and has secured a proposal from a vendor that it would recommend for this project on the condition that each party hereto executes this interlocal Agreement and Contract, signifying its agreement to follow this Agreement and to fully cooperate and assist in the effective and efficient procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, in accordance with the terms and conditions provided for herein; and

WHEREAS, all parties hereto do desire to enter this Interlocal Agreement and Contract, to signify their respective agreements to follow this Agreement and to fully cooperate and assist in

the effective and efficient procurement, implementation and operation of the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, in accordance with the terms and conditions provided for herein.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES AND THE COVENANTS AND CONDITIONS CONTAINED HEREINAFTER, THE PARTIES HERETO DO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Designation of Lead Agency.

The parties hereto hereby designate Macon County as the Lead Agency for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, Macon County Transit and its Director shall lead the procurement, implementation and operation thereof in cooperation with the Transit Directors of the Transit Agencies of the other parties hereto. All other parties hereto and their Transit Agencies and Transit Directors shall work cooperatively with Macon County Transit as the Lead Agency and its Director in connection with the procurement, implementation and operation of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina.

Section 2. <u>Purposes of Agreement.</u> The purposes of this Agreement ("Agreement") are threefold as follows:

- (a). To allow the Procuring Agent to obtain proposals for demand response scheduling and routing software, tablets, web portal, interactive voice response telephone system as part of the One Call One Click Initiative for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina in accordance with applicable Federal and State law, and to enable procurament of the same by the Procuring Agent for Itself and the Principals as provided for herein;
- (b). For the Procuring Agent and the Principals to agree to cooperatively implement within Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, the SonCvet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, in accordance with applicable Federal and State law, as provided for herein; and
- (c). For the Procuring Agent and the Principal to agree to cooperatively operate within Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, the SonCvet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, in accordance with applicable Federal and State law, as provided for herein.

Section 3. Delegation of Authority. The Principals hereby delegate unto the Procuring Agent the authority to conduct a Request for Proposal for the Principals and the Procuring Agent for the purchase, delivery and installation of demand response routing and scheduling software, including regional coordination, tablets, web access and interactive voice response telephone system (referred to hereafter as "Goods and Services") for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and in accordance with the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number, DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference, and do hereby ratify in full its efforts in that regard. The Principals do further delegate unto the Procuring Agent the authority to enter into procurement a contract for the purchase of the Goods and Services on behalf of the Procuring Agent and on behalf of the Principals for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swaln County, North Carolina, in accordance with the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference. This Agreement does not obligate the Procuring Agent or the Principals to purchase any of the Goods or Services.

Section 4. Effective Date of Agreement. This Agreement shall become effective on February ______, 2014.

Section 5. Procurement Procedures. This Procurement shall follow the requirements set forth in the North Carolina General Statutes 143-129.8 and in the Federal Transportation Authority (FTA) Circular 4220.1F. All Terms and Conditions set forth in the Request for Proposal document dated November 27, 2013, entitled "SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation - Macon County, Lead Agency", are hereby incorporated by reference. Macon County shall also comply with its Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Program Grant Agreement with the North Carolina Department of Transportation, DOT Number: DOT-19, Project Number: 13-04-0052. All Principals shall cooperate with the Procuring Agent and agree to comply with all those requirements applicable to the Procuring Agent imposed by the Procuring Agency's Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Program Grant Agreement with the North Carolina Department of Transportation, DOT Number: DOT-19, Project Number: 13-04-0052 and the FTA Master Agreement.

Section 6. Award of Contract. The proposals shall be reviewed by the Transit Director for Macon County Transit and the Transit Director will present a recommendation to the Macon County Commissioners for the award of the procurement contract for the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina, and Swain County, North Carolina. All parties hereto shall comply with the provisions of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 143-128.8 (d) which provides that such proposals shall not be subject to public inspection until a contract is awarded. The Macon County Board of Commissioners may consider, but is not bound by the recommendation. Macon County, within its sole discretion, will award any procurement contract. Once the procurement contract has been executed by the Procuring Agent for the benefit of the Procuring Agent and the Principals and the vendor, a copy of procurement contract shall be forwarded to the Principals.

Section 7. Record Retention. All other parties hereto and their Transit Agencies and Transit Directors agree to and shall work cooperatively with Macon County Transit as the Lead Agency and its Director in connection with the procurement of goods and services necessary for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swaln County, North Carolina, as proposed in the Grant Proposal prepared by Kim Angel, Transit Director for Macon County Transit, dated April 19, 2012, (hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Proposal") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference, and in accordance with the terms of the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number: DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Agreement") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference.

Section 9. implementation. Macon County as the Lead Agency for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and through Macon Transit Agency and its Director shall lead the implementation thereof in cooperation with the Transit Directors of the Transit Agencies of the other parties hereto. All other parties hereto and their Transit Agencies and Transit Directors agree to and shall work cooperatively with Macon County Transit as the Lead Agency and its Director as well as the vendor selected in connection with the implementation of the SoNCVet; Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, as proposed in the Grant Proposal prepared by Kim Angel, Transit Director for Macon County Transit, dated April 19, 2012, (hereinafter referred to as the "Grant Proposal") a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference, and in accordance with the terms of the Public Transportation Section 5309 Capital Grant Agreement between the State of North Carolina and Macon County, DOT Number; DOT-19, and Project Number: 13-04-0052(hereinafter referred to as the 'Grant Agreement') a copy of which is on file with Macon County Transit and is incorporated herein by reference.

Section 10. Operation. Macon County as the Lead Agency for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, and through Macon Transit Agency and its Director shall lead the operation thereof in cooperation with the Transit Directors of the Transit Agencies of the other parties

hereto. (a) <u>Duration</u>. This Agreement shall be 60-months unless terminated earlier by mutual agreement. The Agreement may be extended for such additional time as the parties all deem appropriate. The governing body of each party hereto has determined that this duration is reasonable by their approval and execution hereof. On such termination, obligations of either side that are still executory are hereby discharged, but any rights based on prior breach or performance survive.

(b) Amendment and Termination. This Agreement may be amended by mutual agreement of the parties. This Agreement is terminated at the end of its duration as provided for herein or as hereinafter modified or may be terminated in accordance with the Agreement of all of the parties

(c) Benefit of Agreement. This Agreement is for the benefit of only the parties hereto and not

any other person, firm, or corporation.

(e) Nature of Agreement and Transaction. Macon County has the responsibility under this Agreement to conduct a procurement as described in this Agreement and to enter into the procurement contract for the benefit of the Procuring Agent and the Principals, also as described in this Agreement. In performing under this Agreement, the Procuring Agent is acting as the agent on behalf of the Principals, and on its own behalf and the Procuring Agent may also purchase Goods and Services for Itself from the same procurement contract. The Procuring Agent does not warrant, or give any opinion, that this procedure, by which the procuring Agent solicits proposals and enters into procurement contract on behalf of the Principals, will be successful or effective. The Principals shall not hold the Procuring Agent liable for any deficiencies in, or failure of, this procedure. The Principals shall indemnify the Procuring Agent for, and hold the Procuring Agent harmless from, any claim by any person, firm, or corporation regarding this procedure or regarding the sale or purchase of the Goods and Services. The PROCURING AGENT SHALL NOT BE LIABLE TO THE PRINCIPALS ON ANY EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO MERCHANTIABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE) with respect to any of the Goods and Services. The parties hereto agree to procure, implement and operate the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project in Macon County, North Carolina, Clay County, North Carolina, Cherokee County, North Carolina and Swain County, North Carolina, as provided for hereinabove.

(f) Method of Financing the Undertaking, Including the Apportionment of Costs and Revenues. The procurement of the Goods and Services for the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-

Click Center for Veterans Transportation will be financed as follows:

Federal Funds in the amount of 80% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation, not in excess of \$459,873.00 from the Grant Agreement above-referenced;

Macon County shall pay the sum of \$18,110.00 unto Macon County as its share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. In addition, Macon County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$6,250.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Clay County shall pay the sum of \$18,110.00 unto Macon County, upon its execution of this Agreement as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Clay County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$6,250.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Cherokee County shall pay the sum of \$18,110.00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, Cherokee County shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$6,250.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA:

The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., a North Carolina Non-Profit Corporation, shall pay the sum of \$16,500.00 unto Macon County as it share of the local share for the remaining 20% of the actual net cost of the SonCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One Click Center for Veterans Transportation. The same shall be held by Macon County and used by it solely for this project. In addition, The State of Franklin Health Council, Inc., shall provide "in-kind" contributions to the project having a value of \$8,250.00, and such "in kind contributions must be approved by the FTA;

Each party hereto shall pay for all its employees which are required to implement and operate the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project cooperatively with the other parties hereto.

Each party hereto shall be entitled to the fares that it charges for the rides that it provides through the SoNCVet: Southwestern NC One-Call One-Click Center for Veterans Transportation project cooperatively with the other parties hereto.

(g) Each party hereto shall at its sole expense during the term of this Agreement maintain, repair and if necessary replace such equipment placed into service in its home County for use in connection with this project. Each party hereto shall be responsible for payment of all maintenance and service fees, hosting fees and data charges incurred within their County for years 2-5.

(h) Each party hereto shall ratify this Agreement by resolution of the its Governing Board and spread the same upon its minutes.

Section 12 Governing Law and Forum. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of North Carolina. The exclusive forum for all actions arising out of this Agreement, that are between the parties to this Agreement, shall be the North Carolina General Court of Justice, in North Carolina.

Section 13. Macon County Policy. Macon County is committed to ensuring that no person is excluded from participating in or denied the benefits of any of the county's services on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability or socioeconomic status as protected by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Executive Order on Environmental Justice. Anyone believing to have been subjected to discrimination under Title VI by the county, its employees or agents, are entitled to file a complaint.

This Agreement has been executed by the Principals and the Procuring Agent by and through duly authorized representatives.

DEPARTMENT HEAD COMMENTS/RECOMMENDATION:

As an ancillary project associated with the construction of the new landfill phase (Phase III), the Solid Waste Department previously discussed with the Board of Commissioners the replacement of an existing waterline along Pannell Lane. With general agreement of the project, funds were secured to complete this project as part of the debt service package on the new phase. The purpose of this project is to upsize the line from 4-inches to 6-inches to accommodate the installation of hydrants for fire protection for the new landfill. Additionally, during installation of the new line, it was proposed that the County seek to reach an agreement with the property owners along Pannell Lane for the County to provide owners with a free connection to the Town of Franklin's public water supply; and, certified abandonment of their drinking water wells. While every protective measure has gone into the design and construction of the new landfill, these wells are the closest in vicinity to the new and future cells in Phase III. Further, these properties directly abut the County's previous public water connection program relative to the Old Franklin Landfill. Therefore, if it is the pleasure of the Board, I would request that authorization to proceed with this project, installing +/- 1000-feet of 6-inch waterline along Pannell Lane. I would further request that the Board authorize the County Attorney to draft and the County enter into an interlocal agreement with the Town of Franklin whereby the Town would accept ownership of the line upon completion. Additionally, authorize the County Attorney to draft agreements with the Pannell Lane property owners for easements and access to complete connection to the public water supply. Should agreements be reached

with all parties, it is preferred that the waterline be constructed along the western edge of Pannell Lane. Should we not be able to reach satisfactory agreements with the property owners, the line would be installed along the eastern edge of Pannell Lane, entirely on County-owned property. Finally, I would ask the Board to approve a resolution drafted by the County Attorney to exempt the bid process and enter into a contract with McGill Associates for engineering services, under \$50,000.00, associated with the proposed construction of the waterline,

The North Carolina Department of Transportation has recently received a formal letter from Macon County property owners along SR1139, Sanders Road, request the department to proceed with condemnation of 4 parcels for the purpose of securing necessary right-of-way for secondary road improvements.

There are 18 total property owners along Sanders Road, 14 property owners have executed the standard NCDOT right-of-way agreement for purpose of roadway construction and asphalt paving. The recorded agreements constitute 77.77% of all property owners along this road and 78% of the total roadway frontage. In accordance with North Carolina General Statue, process of condemnation shall be allowed should 75% of all property owners agree to sign right-of-way and a majority of the total roadway frontage is secured.

In order for the Department to proceed with condemnation, it is requested that the respective Board of County Commissioners pass resolution in support of the action. AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE RECREATION OPPORTUNITIES

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this the ____ day of January, 2017, by and between Macon County (hereinafter "County"), a North Carolina Body Politic and Corporate, and Scaly Mountain Historical Society, Inc., (hereinafter "Historical Society"), a North Carolina non-profit corporation.

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS the State of North Carolina by way of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-351 has established the following as policy for the State of North Carolina concerning recreation:

"The lack of adequate recreational programs and facilities is a menace to the morals, happiness, and welfare of the people of this State. Making available recreational opportunities for citizens of all ages is a subject of general interest and concern, and a function requiring appropriate action by both State and local government. The General Assembly therefore declares that the public good and the general welfare of the citizens of this State require adequate recreation programs, the creation, establishment, and operation of parks and recreation programs is a proper governmental function, and that it is the policy of North Carolina to forever encourage, foster, and provide these facilities and programs for all of its citizens."

; and

WHEREAS, N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-352 provides that "Recreation" means activities that are diversionary in character and aid in promoting entertainment, pleasure, relaxation, instruction, and other physical, mental and cultural development and leisure time experiences; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 153A-444, the County is authorized to establish parks and provide recreational programs; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 153A-449, the County is authorized to contract with and appropriate money to any person, association, or corporation, in order to carry out any public purpose that the County is authorized by law to engage in; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for recreation opportunities in the Scaly Mountain area of Macon County, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, Scaly Mountain Historical Society, Inc., (Historical Society), does own a building known as the Old Scaly School House, located at 41 Buck Knob Road, Scaly Mountain, North Carolina 28775 (hereinafter referred to as the Old Scaly School House) and does agree with County as provided for hereinafter for such facility to be used in part for public "recreation" as that term is defined by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-352 and provide recreational opportunities to the general public at such location, and County does agree with Historical Society as provided for hereinafter to appropriate and provide funds to Historical Society in accordance with the provisions of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 153A-449 to carry out the public purpose of providing recreation opportunities to the general public at the Old Scaly School House.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE COVENANTS CONTAINED HEREINAFTER, THE PARTIES DO HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That Historical Society shall make the Old Scaly School House, located at 41 Buck Knob Road, Scaly Mountain, North Carolina 28775, open and available to members of the general public during reasonable days and hours for recreation as that term is defined by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-352 for the period between July 1, 2016, and the end of June 30, 2017, and it shall provide recreational opportunities to the general public at such location.
- 2. The Historical Society shall perform its obligations hereunder in a nondiscriminatory fashion appropriate for public activity and there shall be no discrimination by it on the basis of race, sex or religion in its performance of such obligation.
- 3. County shall pay Historical Society upon the execution of this Agreement the sum of \$5,000.00 for making the Old Scaly School House open and available to members of the general public during reasonable days and hours for recreation as that term is defined by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-352 for the period between July 1, 2016, and the end of June 30, 2017, and for providing recreational opportunities to the general public.
- 4. Historical Society shall account to County for its expenditures and uses of the monies provided by County to Historical Society in accordance with paragraph number three above and Historical Society shall use such monies only for the public purpose of making the Old Scaly School House open and available to members of the general public during reasonable days and hours for recreation as that term is defined by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 160A-352 for the period between July 1, 2016, and the end of June 30, 2017, and for providing recreational opportunities to the general public.
- 5. Historical Society shall at all times properly maintain the Old Scaly School House in a condition for use as a safe place of public recreation.
- 6. This Agreement shall not be construed to be a lease.
- 7. Historical Society is an independent contractor.

- 8. Historical society shall maintain throughout the term of this Agreement property damage insurance and liability insurance in amounts as will protect it against any and all damages, liability, loss and claims to the Historical Society, Old Scaly School House, appurtenances and approaches thereto, in any manner caused directly or indirectly by, arising from, incident to, or in connection with its use or occupancy of the Old Scaly School House and its performance of its duties under this Agreement.
- 9. County may periodically inspect and monitor Historical Society's performance of its obligations hereunder.
- 10. The laws of the State of North Carolina shall control and govern this Agreement. Any controversy or claim arising out of this Agreement shall be settled by action instituted in the appropriate Division of the General Court of Justice in Macon County, North Carolina.
- 11. This Agreement may be modified only by written agreement executed by the parties hereto.

Gentlemen,

I hope each of you had a great Christmas. As you will recall, the Board of Commissioners approved a contract for Pictometry, subject to changes recommended by the County Attorney at our December 13, 2016 Board Meeting. At this meeting, the contract presented separated the project into 2 flights, one in 2017 and the second in 2020. The total amount of this contract was \$195,232.99 and was to be paid in 6 annual payments of approximately \$32,524 beginning July 1, 2017.

Following Chester's review, the amount of the contract has not changed (\$195,232.99). The way in which we would be paying for it however, has changed. Essentially, by allowing us to pay in 6 annual payments as originally proposed, Pictometry was offering us interest free financing, which is not compliant with North Carolina Law (Chester's email to Bradley Robertson at Pictometry explaining this is below highlighted in Yellow). Thus, to be compliant with NC Law we will be required to pay for Pictometry's services as we receive them which is \$97,571.04 by July 31, 2017 for the first flight project and \$97,661.95 by July 31,2020 for the second flight project (2 lump sum payments).

As the Pictometry representative stated at the meeting, the company flies counties all across the United States and must do so in winter months when canopy cover is minimal. As a result, contract approvals must be submitted by early January to secure a spot in the annual flight schedule. In Richard's discussion with Pictometry he has informed me that waiting until our January 10, 2017 meeting could potentially jeopardize our securing a slot in Pictometry's 2017 flight schedule.

I realize the contract as revised is completely different than the contract we discussed on December 13, 2016. I will need a unanimous consensus however, to sign the revised contract prior to our discussing it at the January 10,2017 meeting. In approving this contract we would be making it a capital priority in the FY 17-18' budget (Our payment for the first project will not be due until July 31, 2017). To recap the benefits of using the Pictometry product were as follows:

- Saves us from hiring a new tax appraiser in the tax office to assist with upcoming revaluation.
- Assists EMS, 911, and Sheriff's Department in preparing for and responding to emergency situations
- Assists Macon County Building Inspections Department and Environmental Health Department confirming new structures or ad-ons to existing structures
- Pictometry has been used by Macon County since 2010 and we have had a great working relationship. The
 software fully integrates with our Keystone tax software, ArcGis Mapping software, and 911 CAD system which
 will allow for a seamless implementation process. While there are other companies out there that can provide
 the orthogonal imagery, we are not familiar with the software, nor have a guarantee the software can integrate
 successfully with our tax, mapping and CAD software systems.
- The revised Pictometry contract (attached) has been approved by our legal counsel

If you would please respond by saying "Yes" for me to move forward with signing the revised contract prior to the January meeting or "No" if you would like me to hold off on signing until we can discuss further I would really appreciate it (again no payment is due until next year's budget). I apologize for having to do business in this manner and if unanimous consensus is received we will ratify this action at our next meeting. The urgency accompanying this situation, again, comes as Pictometry is finalizing their flight schedule for 2017 and we need to secure a slot as soon as possible to ensure we can use the imagery in the upcoming revaluation process.

Dear Bradley:

I am in receipt of your e-mail below. First, let me say that both my client and I greatly appreciate your company's offer of interest tree financing. However, ham of the opinion that the County will need to pay for the services that it receives from your company as it receives such services in order for this contract to not be considered a financing arrangement.

As you know. I represent only Macon County and I in no way represent your company. Notwithstanding that and in an attempt to sensitize your company to the concern that I have, I am going to provide you with some information that may better help you understand my concerns. PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT YOU SHOULD NOT ACT UPON INFORMATION THAT I PROVIDE TO YOU AS I DO NOT REPRESENT YOU OR YOUR COMPANY'S LEGAL COUNSEL.

In short, there is not a simple citation to a statute to answer your inquiry. North Carolina Counties derive their authority to act from our State Constitution and from our General Assembly. Absent authority from one or the other, North Carolina Counties are without authority to act. Unlike you and I or the company that you work for, North Carolina Counties may not simply go to a bank or a vendor enter into general loan or financing agreements. Instead, Counties are limited to specific types of financing arrangements. Most of these arrangements are considerably more complicated than at typical financing arrangement. If Counties enter financing arrangements which are not specifically authorized, I am of the opinion that such financing transactions are subject to being questioned from a legal validity standpoint. Such a concern obviously causes great concern for both parties to any such financing arrangment or contract which contains financing. The costs could be extremely high to the County. I am attaching a copy of an Article from County and Municipal Government in North Carolina, entitled "Financing Capital Projects" which was written by Professor Kara A. Millonzi, at the NC School of Government. Hopefully, this will help you and your Company better understand my concern concerning financing arrangements for Counties in North Carolina.

When I evaluated your company's contract proposal to Macon County, it appeared that your company graciously offered to let Macon County pay over a six year period. I am of the opinion that this gracious offer essentially offers interest free financing and thus constitutes financing of the sums due under the contract proposal to Macon County. As you can see, your company's contract proposal is not structured in a manner by which Macon County can borrow (see article above). I knew my opinion would not necessarily be well received and so to confirm my opinion before delivering it, I contacted Professor Kara Millonzi at the NC School of Government at UNC-Chapel Hill to get her opinion as well. We discussed your company's contract proposal to Macon County and the payment provisions of the same. She concurred with me that the same was essentially interest free financing. She likewise indicated that she shared my concern about such financing to Macon County was not compliant with NC law.

I hope this is of some help.

- The service postulates imagery with low off-nadir (The sides of houses cannot be seen) is used. All problems arising from off-nadir of imagery are out of the specifications.

FEES; PAYMENT TERMS

STANDARD ORTHO MOSAIC PRODUCTS

Pictometry standard ortho mosaic products are produced through automated mosaicking processes that incorporate digital elevation data with individual Pictometry ortho frames to create large-area mosaics on an extremely cost-effective basis. Because these products are produced through automated processes, rather than more expensive manual review and hand-touched corrective processes, there may be inherent artifacts in some of the resulting mosaics. While Pictometry works to minimize such artifacts, the Pictometry standard ortho mosaic products are provided on an 'AS IS' basis with respect to visible cutlines along mosaic seams resulting from the following types of artifacts:

- Disconnects in non-elevated surfaces generally caused by inaccurate elevation data;
- ii. Disconnects in elevated surfaces (e.g., roadways, bridges, etc.) generally caused by elevated surfaces not being represented in the elevation data;
- iii. Building intersect and clipping generally caused by buildings not being represented in the elevation data;
- Seasonal variations caused by images taken at different times during a season, or during different seasons;
- Ground illumination variations caused by images taken under different illumination (e.g., sunny, high overcast, morning light, afternoon light, etc.) within one flight day or during different flight days;

Other Pictometry products may be available that are less prone to such artifacts than the Pictometry standard ortho mosaic products.

RapidAccess—Disaster Response Program ("DRP")

 - Earthquake: areas affected by damage to critical infrastructure resulting from earthquakes measured at 6.0 or higher on the Richter scale.
 - Tsunami: areas affected by damage to critical infrastructure resulting from tsunamis.
- Discounted Rate Coverage for areas affected by the events set forth above exceeding 200 square miles will be, subject to Pictometry resource availability, offered to Customer at the then current DRP rates. Also, coverage for areas affected by hurricanes below Category II, tornadoes below EF4 or earthquakes rated below 6.0 on the Richter scale will be, subject to Pictometry resource availability, offered to Customer at the then current DRP rates

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
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SECTOR MAP(S)
